
Saving Arm Pit by Natalie Hyde (Fitzhenry and Whiteside, 2011)

Discussion Questions

- 4. Clay tells the story in first person. And he is the one to come up with the letter



writing campaign to bring business to the post office. Sophie says on p. 73 "a bunch of kids can't change anyone's mind." Why did his teammates at first give up on writing letters?

- 5. The team' letter writing resulted in many positive changes for their town. Which letter do you think was most successful? How did the letters ultimately save the Post office?
- 6. What about the baseball action? Was it probable that the team could go from dead last to third place in the season? How did this happen?
- 7. What do you think about the coed team with a girl playing, and playing well along with the boys?
- 8. In this book it is the kids who bring about change not the adults do you think kids have the power to make changes?

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
