America's transition to a cleaner, advanced, and more resilient energy infrastructure is a key driver of job growth that will forever change the fabric of this nation. Solar and wind jobs outnumber coal and gas jobs in 30 State, including the District of Columbia. Last year, energy storage jobs surged to over 90,000. Grid modernization efforts have created more than 50,000 jobs, and there ae 174,000 Americans who develop and manufacture electric vehicles currently.
