Jamal Khashaoogi

A Saudi journalist, self-exiled, was a frequent critic of Saudi leadership. He was evidently killed in the Saudi Embassy in Turkey and brought back to Saudi Arabia. U.S. Department of State is investigating. (cf. the Magnitsky Act)

Global Magnitsky Human Rights Act – This law gives the U.S. President 120 days to determine whether a foreign national is behind an extra-judicial killing, torture or other human rights violation of someone exercising freedom of expression.
