Our Youth Services team offers a variety of programs and services to help students go from learning to read to reading to learn. Most are familiar with our summer reading program, which is designed to help avoid the "summer slide." But not as many know about the work we do with Stamford Public Schools during the school year. For example, the Friends Book

Shop offers teachers five free books each month for their classroom libraries. We also provide teacher cards with extended loans and can help teachers find materials for a subject unit.

Parents with elementary school students may know about our Purple Bus program that brings students to the DiMattia Building for an introduction to the library.
