



Those items will renew automatically and you will receive an email with the new due date. (We won't be able to renew an item if someone is waiting for it, or if it is from our Express Collection.) Does this mean you can keep a book for a year? Well no. Items still can only be renewed two times. After your second renewal, you will receive emails telling you that your item is due soon, is due now, or is overdue. We hope this new feature makes your life a little easier.






