#### The NEA Big Read Coming in October Toni Morrison's Beloved

The Ferguson Library has received a \$12,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts to participate in a community-wide Big Read. We hope you'll join us in reading or re-reading Toni Morrison's classic novel, Beloved.

We kick off a month-long series of Big Read programs October 2 with a book give-

away and the first of three workshops to create a community quilt evoking the rich world of Beloved.

Our keynote address October 7 will feature Swarthmore College President Valerie Smith, the author of Toni Morrison: Writing the Moral Imagination.
